Washington, DC (July 11, 2024): – Whitman-Walker, a leader in LGBTQ health care, research, education and policy with special expertise in HIV care, is proud to join Mayor Muriel Bowser in announcing the proclamation of July 16, 2024, as PrEP Awareness Day in Washington, DC. This day is dedicated to raising awareness about the life-saving benefits of Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) and its critical role in the fight against HIV/AIDS.

The Facts

HIV/AIDS continues to be a significant public health challenge, with over 1.2 million people in the United States living with HIV and thousands of new infections each year. To combat this, PrEP, an FDA-approved medication, has proven to reduce the risk of HIV infection by up to 99% when taken as prescribed. Approved by the FDA on July 16, 2012, PrEP is a cornerstone of comprehensive HIV prevention strategies, offering an effective tool for men who have sex with men, transgender individuals, cis-gender women, heterosexual individuals with HIV-positive partners, and people who inject drugs.

Despite its proven efficacy, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), less than 25% of the approximately 1.2 million Americans who could benefit from PrEP are currently using it. This statistic underscores the need for enhanced public education and outreach to ensure that more individuals, especially those in marginalized communities, are aware of and have access to PrEP.

"PrEP Awareness Day is a vital step in our ongoing commitment to health equity and the fight against HIV/AIDS," said Mayor Muriel Bowser of the District of Columbia. "By increasing awareness and accessibility of PrEP, we can protect our most vulnerable populations and move closer to ending the HIV epidemic."

PrEP Awareness Day supports the goals of the federal initiative "Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America," which aims to reduce new HIV infections in the United States by 90% by 2030. The City of Washington, DC, is dedicated to advancing health equity and ensuring that all residents have access to life-saving interventions such as PrEP, regardless of their socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, or gender identity.

"Whitman-Walker Health has led DC's efforts in implementing PrEP as an effective prevention strategy. PrEP Awareness Day is our call to action to provide access to and education on this effective medication to prevent HIV in our communities, particularly vulnerable communities. It's a reminder that we can have control over our sexual and overall health on our own terms," said Juan Carlos Loubriel, Senior Director of Community Health and Wellness, Whitman-Walker Health. "If we are serious about ending the HIV epidemic, we must continue to address health inequities and increase access and education to PrEP for everyone."

Whitman-Walker echoes Mayor Bowser's call upon all District residents, healthcare providers, and community organizations to participate in efforts to increase awareness, understanding, and accessibility of PrEP. Through collective action, we can work towards a future free from HIV and ensure the health and safety of all community members.
